

Crossle pg 308 a

Crossle's Page 308 consists of three overlapping images depicting a Beatty descendancy chart. The original must have been over 30 inches wide. Since it is difficult to transcribe the chart, a text version is being used. For the next few pages, all bearing the heading of "Crossle pg 380 x", are the resulting transcription of that chart, along with its accompanying notes.

Each person of direct lineage is given a number, starting with the most distant, William Beatty, who is number one. His children number 2 to 5. Information pertinent to this William will be entered prior to showing the wife/husband and children, who will be consecutively numbered. To keep the names linked to their ancestors I am using superscript thus: **James Beatty**^{3 William 2 William 1} indicating James is third generation descended from William in the second generation and William in the first generation of the chart. Be aware the order of birth must yet be verified. The names on the chart have no dates; it is therefore possible the actual birth order is different.

While transcribing this data I will use editorial brackets, [sample DL], to indicate text I have added during transcription. Such insertions are intended to clarify the original text and are not a part of the Crossle papers. Some punctuation has been added for clarity. When unsure of the spelling I will enter an editorial bracket with a ? thus [?].

1. William Beatty Will dated 4 Oct 1685, lodged on Diocese of Armagh (not proved) m. Margaret Russell of Cookstown, parish Dariloran, Co. Tyrone. Margaret's will dated 8 July 1689; proved in Diocese of Armagh 20 March 1691. Desires to be buried in Londonderry from which we gather she took refuge there (with her son [William DL]) & died during the siege. [An additional note by Crossle DL] her will must have been written while she was in Derry during the siege, along with her son Wm.

[There is another note regarding Margaret Russell Beatty, and W. Beatty, but it is so faint, and split between two images, that I am unable to make any guess as to what information it might contain. DL]

2. William Beatty^{2 William 1} (only son) probably can be identified with the Derry hero [see the note below DL] was probably the same William Beatty who, with the other parishioners of Lissan, in March 1696/97 got a lease of tithes of sd Parish and in 1709 sued at the Court of Exchequer to recover same agst Rev. Adam Usher and John Farquhar. m subsequently and had twelve sons.

[**Note by Crossle** for William Beatty, hero of Derry DL] William Beatty was a Captain of the Garrison of Derry in the siege of 1689 in which "he ever behaved himself with great integrity and valour," taking part in all important engagements, and also going out almost daily with small parties to harass the Besiegers until about a month before the end of the siege, having been attacked with a severe illness, he withdrew, under protection, to his home.

7. William Beatty^{3 William 2 William 1} Sometimes of Newry, co. Down. When he died 18 Dec. 1735 he was Cashier in the office of the Collector of Revenue, at Dublin. Administration 18 Dec 1735 to George Boyd, principle Creditor. M[married DL] Mary before 1723.

[From Crossle pg 254: “Vincent Beatty joined the 24th Light Dragoons as Cornet, 24th March 1801; Lieut., 25 October 1802; Capt. 4th April, 1807; was placed on half-pay of the regiment on 20th Nov. 1817, with the rank of Cornet; he married, 22 Oct 1812 Belinda, daughter of Whitewell Butler, of Waterville, Co. Kerry, and niece of Archdeacon Robert Beatty’s wife.” DL]

26. James Beatty^{4 Vincent 3 William 2 William 1} of Derry where he was an officer (gauzer) of Revenue afterwards a merchant there. Will dat. 30 Oct 1817 pr. 12 Jan 1819.

[From Crossle pg 254; “James Beatty, who was an officer of the Revenue at Derry (second son of Vincent Beatty, sometimes of Downpatrick, but later of Clones) married Anne Smyth, and had four sons and two daughters.” Also in a later paragraph says Anna Beatty incorrectly shown as the daughter of Vincent, see # 31 below, “Anna Beatty, born 1782; married 11 July 1805 Captain John Popham Baker, R. N. And has a son Frederick Walter Baker (Rev) born 16 Apr, 1814, incumbent at Beaulieu, Southampton.” DL]

He Subsequently became surgeon of Greenwich Hospital, was knighted in York Street, London, 25th March 1842.

[Crossle pg 254 shows Eliza Beatty, probably this one, as follows: “Eliza Beatty, married 1 October, 1808, to her cousin, Rev. Robert Beatty, Archdeacon of Ardagh.” DL]

[On Crossle pg 254 the following: “ James Beatty second son of Vincent of Downpatrick at Derry, was married, and is not to be confused with his son James Beatty, junior, of Derry, merchant, who died unmarried in 1818.” No mention of Wm. here. DL]

She was b. 1806 d. 8 May 1879.
